## Workshop 4: Organizer Editing Methods

### Objective

Working with **Organizer Editing** methods:

1-Organizer selections - 2-Quick Fix - 3-Guided Edit - 4-Full Edit

---

### Exercise 04-01

**Image:** *End of rail.jpg*

- Open *End of rail.jpg* image
- Move thumbnail slider full right (or double click) for maximum image.
- Choose, in turn, each of the 7 editing choices to observe effect (after each **Control Z** to revert to original image).
- Combine choices of your selection to see effect.

---

### Exercise 04-02

**Image:** *rfox-before.jpg*

- Open *rfox-before.jpg* image
- Select Quick Fix in Task Pane
- In lower left **VIEW**: click drop-down symbol and choose - **Before and After Horizontal**
- Click on hand on left side vertical tool bar for maximum image (this is home)
- Select each category and try “**Auto**” to see effect. Click on “**Reset**” in upper right corner to revert back to original image
- Again choose each category and move sliders to see effect—for changes to take effect, the check-mark on the task bar has to be selected
- Click on **X** upper right corner to close window—a dialog box appears—check **No**-back to the organizer

---

### Exercise 04-03

**Image:** *StPeters.jpg*

- Open *StPeters.jpg* image in organizer
- Under Fix on right pan—select **Guided Edit**—to maximize image
- Again double click on **Hand** to maximize image
- In lower left of pane note **small arrow** in a box—**check** to select before and after view
- Try each of the editing possibilities to see effect on image—move sliders
- Click the **X** in the upper right corner to revert back to **Organizer**—select **No** in the dialog box

---

### Exercise 04-04

**Image:** *wedding-before.jpg*

- Open the *wedding-before.jpg* image
- Edit the image using: Selections in Organizer, **Quick Fix**, and **Guided Edit**.
- Determine the most convenient for you for editing.

In many cases, the “Quick” methods demonstrated are convenient and can be used on 50% or more of your images requiring editing.
